
ABOUT STRATHCONA

LLOYDMINSTER ASSETS

Our Lloydminster Assets are split up between two Business Units (BUs); Lloydminster Conventional and Lloydminster Thermal.

LLOYDMINSTER CONVENTIONAL

Strathcona's Lloydminster Conventional assets are characterized by multiple large oil-inplace reservoirs with existing and expanding enhanced oil recovery (EOR) opportunities primarily located in southwest Saskatchewan. EOR extraction requires injecting fluids into a hydrocarbon reservoir to tailor pressure, displace hydrocarbons to production wells, or alter reservoir fluids to improve hydrocarbon flow.

LLOYDMINSTER THERMAL

Strathcona's Lloydminster thermal properties rely on the same steam-assisted gravity drainage (SAGD) processes as our Cold Lake properties. Given the unique nature of the geology in Saskatchewan, our Saskatchewan-based thermal operations are designed as small, modular facilities, creating opportunities for staged, low-cost growth without the need for major infrastructure further minimizing surface impact.

"The Lloyd Thermal division is very unique. Our SAGD facilities are ~90% identical and they are located 20-30 mins of each other. We encourage our team members to support projects and collaborate on learnings at each of the facilities. This has created a safe and efficient Lloyd Thermal team culture amongst the staff that I am proud to be part of."

ABOUT LLOYDMINSTER

Lloydminster is a vibrant bi-provincial community straddling the border of Alberta and Saskatchewan. Approximately 32,000 people call Lloydminster home and the city was recently ranked among one of the fastest-growing communities in Canada.

Products and services are easily accessible, often within a seven-minute drive. In recent years, Lloydminster welcomed popular franchises including Best Buy, Home Depot, HomeSense, Old Navy and Rona; to name a few. These retailers conduct extensive due diligence and their research shows Lloydminster is a community on the move, providing excellent long-term potential.

With over a dozen schools from primary to post-secondary, including Lakeland College, Lloydminster is also in close proximity to University of Alberta, University of Saskatchewan, Sask Polytech and Portage College.

LOCAL ECONOMY

Lloydminster, known as the 'Heavy Oil Capital of the World,' has a robust economy driven by the petroleum industry. Agriculture also plays a vital role, with wheat, barley and canola accounting for over 30% of the area's cultivated land. Notably, Lloydminster is home to one of Canada's largest canola crushing facilities and the country's largest biodiesel plant, underscoring its prominence in both the agriculture and oil sectors.

RECREATION

There is no shortage of year-round recreational activities in Lloydminster. Organize a game at one of the four indoor arena facilities, or enjoy one of the seasonal outdoor rinks. Go for a swim at the Bioclean Aquatic Centre, which offers aquatic programs, educational and training courses and birthday parties. The Lloydminster Golf and Curling Centre features an 18-hole championship golf course, driving range and short game facility. Mount Joy offers close-by snowsports and a plethora of other outdoor activities, and the Servus Sports Centre is the city's largest multi-sport and event-hosting complex.

Between these options and the over 40 parks and green spaces around the city, the opportunity for adventure is endless in Lloydminster.
